Notice of Grant Funding Opportunity

Housing Alaskans: A Public-Private Partnership (HAPPP) is accepting grant applications for "top-off" funding of up to \$150,000 for new construction and rehabilitation housing projects. The grant funding is for a limited solicitation of a narrow scope of projects. It is intended to deploy funding quickly for housing projects ready to break ground or to be completed in 2023. This initial "top-off" investment opportunity is completely independent of all future HAPPP funding opportunities. The application deadline is Sunday, June 4, 2023, at 11:59 p.m.

Application Background

HAPPP was formed to address Alaska's housing crisis by using creative funding solutions that bridge the gap to bring housing projects online, incentivizing housing developers and providers with operational and capital funding to help projects cross the finish line. HAPPP will help address Alaska's serious housing challenges: housing affordability, housing development, and aging housing stock. Funds will support the state's most urgent and timely housing projects through a competitive process overseen by a diverse board of Alaska leaders. The fund was established in 2022 with an initial \$1 million from the State of Alaska and a grant from Rasmuson Foundation.

HAPPP is a new housing funding entity and, at this point, has only a small amount of funding available (approx. \$400,000). While HAPPP increases its resources, a portion of the limited funds is available for housing projects ready to break ground or be completed in 2023. These



grants are meant to help projects waiting on the sidelines due to construction cost increases or a financial gap that has prohibited breaking ground or projects being completed.

Alaska's housing need is dire. HAPPP is a housing accelerator fund that urgently wants to deliver money to shovel-ready projects that need "top-off" funding to either break ground or complete construction this year. We recognize that the application period is short; however, this application is targeted at established projects in Alaska that require a small amount of funding to come online. This initial "top-off" investment opportunity is completely independent of all future HAPPP funding opportunities.

About Housing Alaskans: A Public-Private Partnership

Alaska's housing crisis is felt statewide, from Ketchikan to Anchorage to Kotzebue, affecting everyday Alaskans – from cooks to cleaners to mail clerks to teachers – who are struggling to afford housing. Many housing projects are complicated, often having complex layered funding sources and sometimes needing a small amount of additional funding to make a project 'pencil' and move forward. HAPPP will collaborate with other housing entities to leverage and combine various funding streams to make it easier for those projects to develop adequate capital more quickly and efficiently. HAPPP is unique to other housing funding entities because it can combine public funds and less-restrictive philanthropic contributions.

HAPPP's Board of Directors represents experienced, influential leaders from across the state who are experts in their respective fields and have been confronting housing issues in their communities and for their employees. The Board provides policy and fiduciary guidance to help bring critical housing projects to fruition in Alaska's communities. The Board represents Alaska's geographic, ethnic, and cultural diversity and will maintain at least half its membership in Alaska Native populations and rural Alaska interests. The Board is assisted by a Technical Advisory Committee comprised of subject matter experts from across Alaska who advise the board on policies, procedures, and projects.

Funding Eligibility Criteria for Housing Project Grants

- "Top off" funding for housing projects able to break ground or be completed in 2023.
- Housing projects anywhere in Alaska.
- Project can serve a population with incomes up to 120% of Average Median Income (AMI).
- Grants may be used for new construction or rehabilitation of existing housing units and may be rental or ownership units.
- Maximum grant award is \$150,000. Available funding is limited for this initial grant opportunity, so please limit the request to the minimum needed to break ground or complete the project.
