## WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM

The Weatherization Program assists Alaskans who want an energy-efficient home that is more comfortable, healthy and saves money. The program has income requirements and the work is done for free by authorized weatherization providers and housing authorities. Alaskan homeowners and renters may both apply for this program.

## SAFE & SOUND WITH WEATHERIZATION

As a retiree living on a fixed income, spending thousands of dollars on a new furnace and hot water heater was simply not in the budget for Kris Anderson. He was spending about \$500 a year on repairs to the vintage furnace and high heating bills showed no signs of letting up. Anderson applied for an AHFC weatherization grant and received \$8,500 in weatherization services. In addition to the increased efficiency and reliability of his home appliances, he now enjoys peace of mind from knowing that he won't suddenly face expensive repairs or find himself without heat during the middle of a cold snap.

**Step 2:** Contact the service area provider or regional housing authority for your area to sign up and get on the waitlist. Visit our website for contact information and coverage areas.

**Step 3:** Priority is given to Alaskans with disabilities, seniors and families with children. When your name reaches the top of the list you can expect to be visited by weatherization crews who will perform cost-effective, energy-efficient improvements on your home.

**Step 4:** Enjoy a healthier, more comfortable and energy-efficient home that saves hundreds of dollars a year on utility bills.
